Environmental Policy Statement

Policy

- Identify and provide relevant training at all levels throughout the business.
- Give staff the opportunity to contribute to the improvement of the EMS through the Evotix system and regular communication.
- Require all staff to perform their duties in compliance with regulatory requirements, EMS, company policy and contractual requirements of their employment.
- Delegate responsibility and authority to all staff for ensuring that the policy is communicated, understood, implemented, and maintained at all levels.
- Work with the EMS to deliver client projects sustainably and without impact to listed buildings and the local environment.
- Select fleet vehicles that optimally balance economy and minimising pollution.
- Regularly monitor and review the effectiveness of the system and identify further system improvements.
- Proactively manage changes that take place within the business to ensure that the integrity of the EMS is maintained.
